**FORMER MAHWAH HIGH SCHOOL TEACHER
CHARGED WITH SEXUAL ASSAULT, CHILD ENDANGERMENT,
AND OFFICIAL MISCONDUCT**

Passaic County Prosecutor Camelia M. Valdes announces the arrest of Joshua Green, age 33, of Clifton, New Jersey.

Joshua Green, a former teacher at Mahwah High School, who is currently employed by another school district, was charged with two counts of Second Degree Sexual Assault, one count of Second Degree Official Misconduct, and one count of Third Degree Endangering the Welfare of a Child for sexual relations with a teenage victim that occurred in 2015. The teenager was a student at the school at the time.

Joshua Green was arrested on April 4, 2018, after an investigation conducted by the Passaic County Prosecutor's Office Special Victims Unit, the Department of Children and Families Institutional Abuse Investigation Unit, and the Mahwah Police Department.

Sexual Assault carries a maximum term of ten years in New Jersey State Prison and Endangering the Welfare of a Child carries a maximum term of five years in New Jersey State Prison. Both charges carry the additional penalties of Megan's Law registration and Parole Supervision for Life; Official Misconduct carries a maximum term of ten years in New Jersey State Prison.

Central Judicial Processing is scheduled for April 5, 2018 in the Criminal Division, Superior Court of New Jersey, Passaic Vicinage, at 1:30PM.
